ANNOUNCEMENTS:

We rejoice to be back in the house of the LORD! What a blessing to be able to gather under the same roof, hear God's Word, receive His gifts, pray and sing His praises together.

At the same time, we recognize that the threat of disease is not over and we are still being asked to take precautions in an attempt to keep one another and our community healthy. Here at church, those precautions include the following things: 1) individuals and family groups need to be seated six feet apart; 2) we will refrain from shaking hands; 3) there will be no passing of the offering plate; 4) distribution of the Sacrament will be done individually; 5) when lining up for communion, we ask you to line up one family group at a time; 6) the communion vessels have been prepared in a sanitized environment, and arranged in a way that seeks to avoid cross-contamination; 7) at the end of the service, we ask everyone to leave one family group at a time and not linger in the building.

Some of what is on this list is good, common-sense stuff, but much of it causes me sadness to even write it out. We are the body of Christ, and physical presence and closeness is a part of that. We pray God to deliver us from evil and continue His work to carry us through this valley of sorrow to Himself in heaven.

We will continue to watch the health reports, and make adjustments so that we may continue to worship, and still continue to help and support our neighbors in their bodies and lives.


Matthew 6:9-13

Take, eat; this is the true body of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, given into death for your sins. Amen.


Take, drink; this is the true blood of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, shed for the forgiveness of your sins. **Amen.**



Divine Service III from Lutheran Service Book

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The Lutheran Church Extension Fund also has an app available for online giving, called *GivePlus*. You can find it in the App Store or the Google Play store.

Today is ROGATE SUNDAY. Traditionally, this day is set aside as one on which Christians give special thanks and praise to God for the bountiful blessings of the field.

The word rogation, comes from the Latin rogare, meaning "to ask" or "to pray." The three days preceding Ascension Day have been known in the Church as Rogation Days, that is, days of prayer, for more than 1,500 years. They began in the fifth century in France, when there had been crop failures due to earthquakes and bad weather, with resulting famine. St. Mamertus, bishop of Vienne faced a volcano whose eruption threatened the years crops, introduced the custom of pastor and people making penitential processions, calling upon God to help, and asking His intervention.

Other communities took up the custom, and St. Gregory the Great later regulated the practice. Since then, it has been the custom to hold, each year before Ascension Day, a special Rogation Service.

The purpose of Rogation Day is to implore the mercy of God that He may keep us from all evils of body and soul, and give to the plants of the field an increase.

In the spring, when the fields are becoming green and there is promise of good harvest—but also the possibilities of destruction through frost, hail, rainstorms, wind, or tornados—the prayers are a reminder to feeble man to turn with humility and confidence to the Giver of all good. For it is not the earth alone, nor the busy hand of man upon which the increase depends; but it is God who gives the increase.

STEWARDSHIP:

James 1:17 – "Every good gift and every perfect gift is from above, coming down from the Father of lights with whom there is no variation or shadow due to change." There are a great many passages in Scripture which echo this theme: everything good we have is from God. He loves to give. He loves to bless. He loves to show us generosity time and again – and He desires that we grow into His image, and reflect His love and openhanded kindness.
